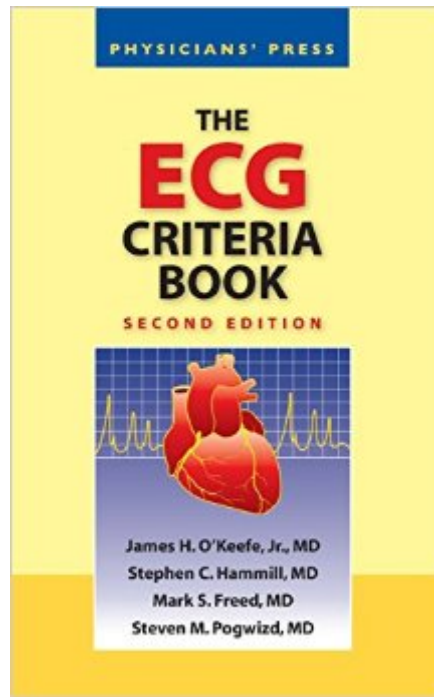


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The ECG Criteria Book

I teach EKG interpretation to 4th year medical students and provide each student with a copy of this book. It fits into a lab coat pocket. There is a small EKG tracing with each example. Provides more information than most entry level interpreters need, but is a fantastic resource. Highly recommended.

I bought this book because I needed a quick and easy-to-carry ECG tool. This is the pocket version of the O'Keefe ECG book and has all the ECG reading criteria, minus the clinical cases. It is easy to browse and can make your life a lot easier especially when you have to read hundreds of ECGs a day.
