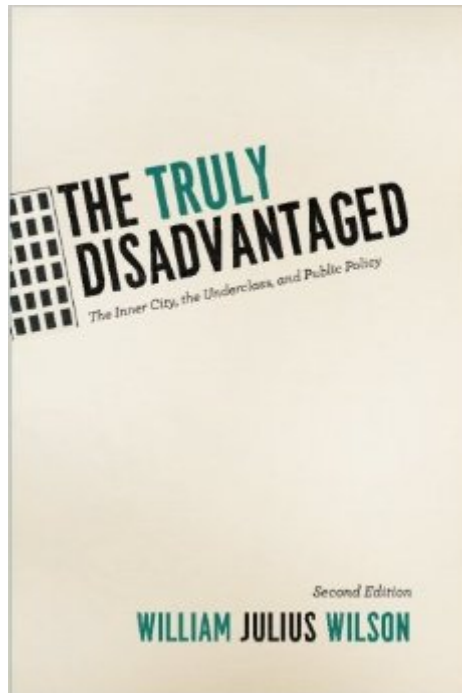

Wilson addresses the inner city problems, the real meaning of underclass and the real root of social dislocation in his book, *The Truly Disadvantaged: The Inner City, The Underclass and Public Policy*. His aim is to challenge the conservative policy analysts perception of the poverty of African Americans who live in the ghettos in the United States. Their perception is that government programs only hinder the African Americans who live in poverty. Mr. Wilson is bringing to the table another rational of why

race and urban poverty co-exist together. Wilson shares some points with data that proves that the conservative policy analysts are incorrect regarding race and urban poverty.
