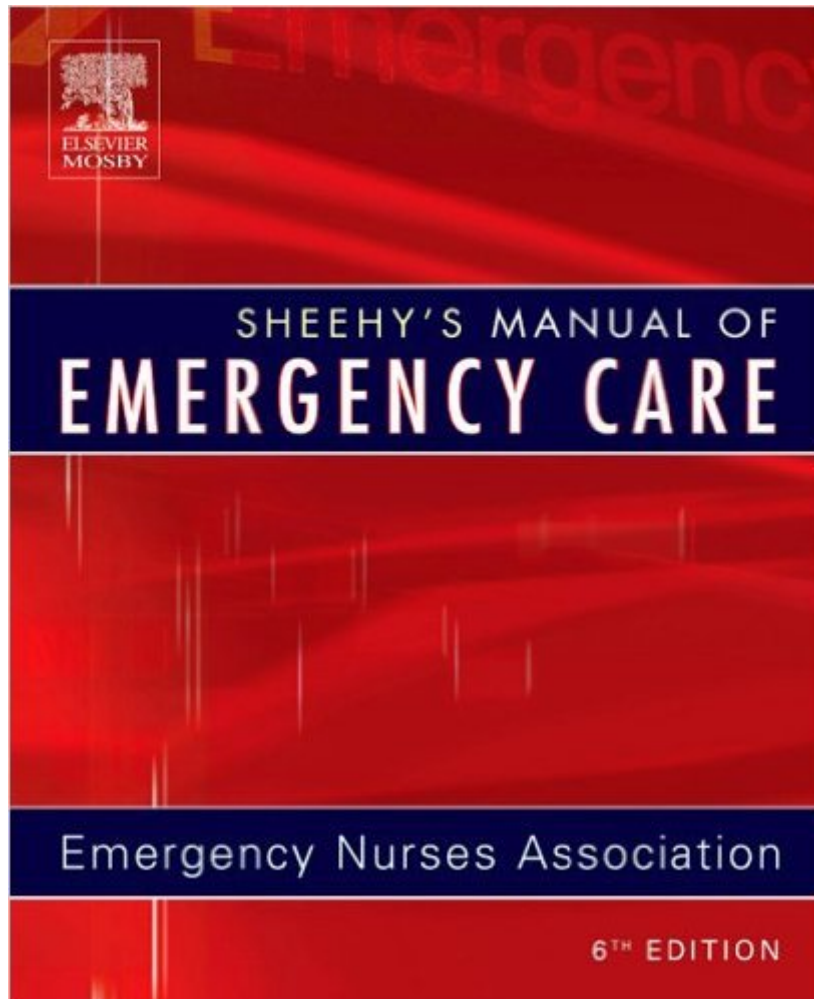


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# Sheehy's Manual Of Emergency Care, 6e (Newberry, Sheehy's Manual Of Emergency Care)
