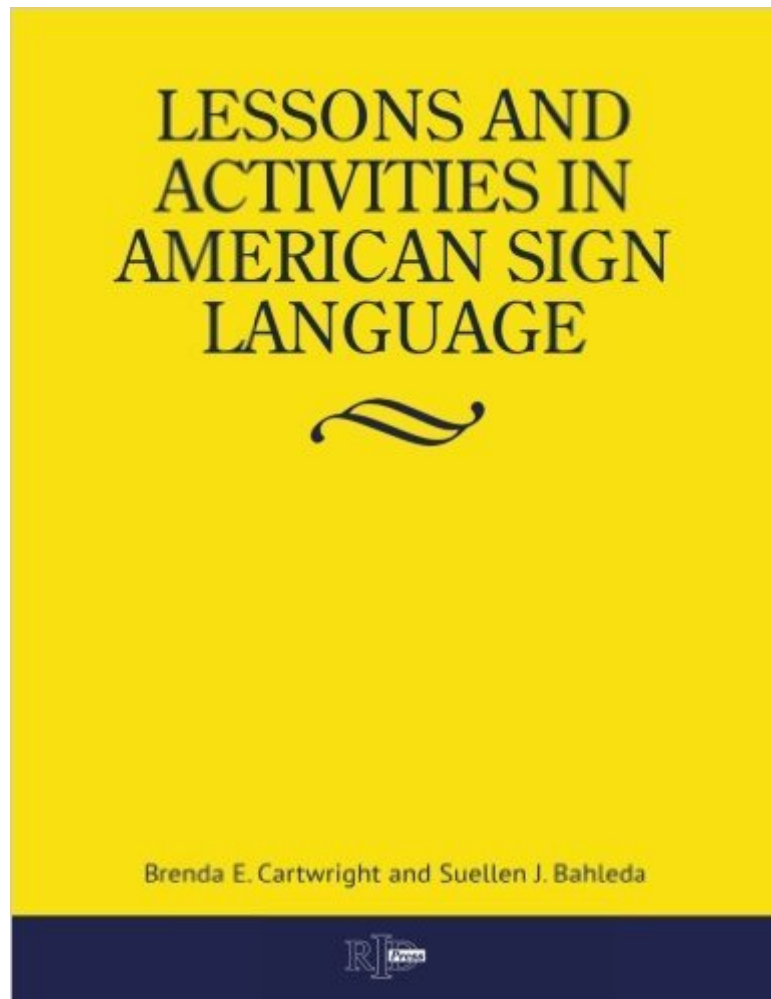


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# Lessons And Activities In American Sign Language

Along with this book we also were required to purchase 'Introduction to the Deaf Community', I got the 5th edition, and it would be in understatement to say this book was helpful because this book saved my life, the alphabet on the back cover is an awesome touch for the moments that I get forgetful of a letter.
