

I discovered this book after reading about Dr Chochinov's research published in The Lancet journal and it is nothing short of remarkable. The first part of the book focuses on this critical research and proves the science-based conclusion which the power of "Dignity Therapy' has upon a patient's life during the last few days or weeks. The remaining book spells out exactly 'how to' create this same dignity document for terminal patients regardless of setting. Several people I know have read this important book and we have begun the process of bring this very critical work to our hospice. If you are involved in anyway with hospice or palliative care or terminally ill patients or family member, you REALLY want to read this book. I cannot imagine a finer or more important process for a dying person!!

As a volunteer for Hospice, I heard of this book and decided to investigate further. A thoughtful approach to end of life concerns, detailing an approach to help dying persons review their lives to prepare a "living on" document to provide insight to survivors. Not everyone would be up for the intensive nature of these conversations, but for those who are, this book provides detailed advice, raises thoughtful concerns and advocates for "doing it right."
