This textbook is thin, but packed with information that's displayed in a captivating and interesting method. Since the publisher wants potential customers to sign up just to preview the inside, I will break down the layout:-The chapter title pages have a full or double-page picture with a short event that relates to what the chapter is about and then the main content is set up in pretty much the same

logical layout as your standard text book.-There are a lot of different types of graphs scattered appropriately throughout each chapter. Most of the pictures have captions asking the reader to think about and relate the picture and the content in critical ways.-The vocabulary terms are conveniently boxed on the side AND placed in bold font within the text.-The chapter ends with a concise summary and a little review test of 20 questions per chapter.-The text is split into three columns instead of two, which is a great way to break the text up into easy-to-read pieces. The general style that the textbook was written in is witty yet efficient, and all of the information in it is current enough to be quite relate-able.
